




Our open access book content is read on average 16 times more and reached almost twice the number of countries than our traditional monographs in the first 6 months of publication.



All the content that is made open access is hosted on our Taylor & Francis eBook site and are sent to major distributors such as Google Books, Kindle, OAPEN and the Open Research Library to increase the exposure of the research. These sources increase the touchpoint researchers have to access work globally and without barriers.





Retrospective conversion opens the readership of your work as it can be found online without barriers. It means that the general public will be able to access and explore your research allowing learners to upskill in the areas that interest them without the financial constraints that may hold some back.

HOW TO CONVERT YOUR TITLE RETROSPECTIVELY

As your work has already been published by Taylor & Francis, there is no need for the work to go through a second peer review process to convert your content to open access. There are no changes or additions needed to the content for the open access version.

- Your contract will be updated with an open access addendum - this will set out the Creative Commons licence that your work will be published under.
- Your editorial contact will take you through how to pay the Books Processing Charge(BPC).
- Your work will be converted to open access. In practical terms this means that the title will be flagged as open access on Routledge.com with an open access symbol and readers from around the globe will be able to access your work on our eBook platform TaylorFrancis.com.

Once the title is converted, it doesn't stop at Taylor & Francis platforms. We send a record of your work to **OAPEN** and the **Open Research Library**, two of the largest open access books repositories.

We also have 30+ metadata feeds to platforms such as **Google Books** and **Amazon** where readers outside of academic institutions can access your work, benefiting independent researchers across the globe.

HOW MUCH IS THE BPC?

The BPC for retrospective open access enables researchers to discover your work and not be barred by subscription fees or download costs.

For work converted to open access retrospectively Taylor & Francis operate a tiered discount system for both books and chapters.

Full Book or Chapter

12 - 24 months post-publication	30% Discount
24 - 36 months post-publication	50% Discount
36 + months post-publication	70% Discount
